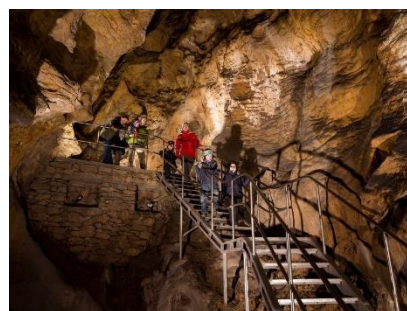
really know what this meant but after some research work we

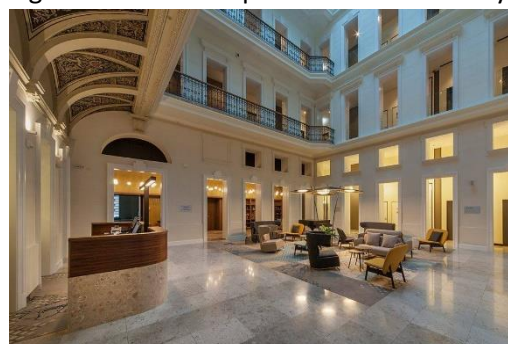
