

Catholic University of Leuven (KU Leuven)

- Established in 1425
- Attracts most foreign students
- Belgium's first and largest university
- Around 57,300 students in 2015 with 11.000 foreign students

- The university ranks 90th in world for life sciences, and 27th for veterinary science
- Around 41,000 students with 5000 foreign students






Cost of living

Monthly budget: \in 920 / month

- Courses, books: **35** €
- Accommodation: **450** €
- Food: **300** €
- Healthcare: 20 €
- Public transport: **40** €
- Miscellaneous (telephone, leisure ...): 75 €





Why study in Belgium?

- Most people can speak English
- Very friendly people for instance Belgian students can become "buddy" of a foreign student
- Located in one of the most densely populated areas in the world

- International students in Belgium will certainly be enriched with a well-rounded and cultured educational experience

Working abroad in Belgium

As a student

- follow an approved course of education
- It is based on a fixed term contract (study points)
- EU students: same rights and obligations as Belgian students
- Foreign students from a country outside the EU must follow an approved course of education in Belgium



Wages and expenses

- Cost of living in Belgium is 14.25% higher than in Germany
- Belgium is a rather expensive country to live in
- In the EU ranking it comes behind Switzerland and the Scandinavian countries

- Universität Augsburg
- Established in 1970

- Close partnerships with several universities in different countries
- Part of the Erasmus+ exchange program

Working abroad in Germany

- Persons from outside the EU need a residence permit
- Persons from within the EU have no problem to work in Germany
- There is a regulation how many persons from other countries can work in different working areas in Germany
- A student might need to work while studying to cover the cost of living

QUALIFICATIONS OTHER THAN ACADEMIC RESULTS

You must provide evidence that your written and spoken English is at a level that will enable you to succeed in your studies.

- IELTS Academic module overall 7.0 with 6.0 in each component
- TOEFL-iBT 100 or above with 20 in each section
- Cambridge English: Advanced & Proficiency overall 185 with 169 in each component
- Pearson Test of English (Academic): Total 67 with at least 56 in each "Communicative Skills" section
- Trinity ISE: ISE III with a pass in all four components

PRACTICAL EXPERIENCE

- Work experience is expected for courses like medicine and veterinary.
- For all courses, work experience is not expected but valued.




HOW MUCH WILL IT COST TO STUDY IN SCOTLAND?




- Lectures

- Minimum wage:



Two famous universities in Hungary


- Corvinus University
 - Established in 1920
 - \$14,000 students
 - Offers educational programs in business administration, economics, and social sciences.
 - Tuition fee: 500 EUR / semester in average





- Semmelweis University Medical School
- Founded in 1635.
- The name of the university honours **Ignác Semmelweis** who was a first advocate of the importance of hygiene during childbirth
- Today it incorporates the: Faculties of Medicine, Dentistry, Pharmacy, Physical Education and Sport Sciences, and the Faculty of Health Sciences.
- Semmelweis University was the first Hungarian higher educational institution that started to offer an international program.
- The tuition fee is $1100\ \text{EUR}$ / semester on average.
